KACC ARRESTS IMPERSONATORS

Dear News Editors,

The Kenya Anti-Corruption Commission (KACC) kindly requests you to publicize and inform the general public of the following.

The Kenya Anti-Corruption Commission (KACC) arrested **Macdonald Kajuma** and **Erick Otieno Tumbho** who have been purporting to be KACC Investigating Officers.

The two male adults (photos attached) presented themselves to Kamili Packers Limited as Investigators of the Kenya Anti-Corruption Commission. They claimed that they were investigating a corruption case against the said Kamili Packers Limited. There was doubt regarding their credibility, behavior and character forcing the company to call the Kenya Anti-Corruption Commission and the Industrial Area Police for assistance. KACC investigators visited the scene and together with the Industrial Police Officers arrested the two suspects. They recovered a fake KACC staff identification card from Macdonald Kajuma claiming that he's a supervisor for the Commission. The two were arraigned in court today the 18th August, 2011 where Macdonald Kajuma took his plea. The prosecution made an application for them to be placed in Police custody for further investigations to take place and will appear in court to face other charges on 22nd August, 2011.

Members of the public are therefore cautioned to be on the lookout for such individuals and to report them immediately to the Kenya Anti-Corruption Commission or the Police. These fraudsters are enriching themselves by extorting money through harassment and solicitation from unsuspecting individuals purporting that they can assist in stopping investigations and/or prosecution of corruption cases.

Kindly publicize and broadcast this information to the public in your respective media. The fight against corruption continues.
